SUBJECT: Intra-District Student Transfers

PURPOSE:

To provide updated information on the number of requested intra-district student transfers as compared to the number of State Board of Education appeals related to these transfers.

BACKGROUND/HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE:

At the February 2, 2018 meeting of the Public School Superintendents Association of Maryland (PSSAM), information was shared with superintendents about the State Board's request for this information. The purpose is to determine how the volume of transfer requests throughout the State compare to the volume that are appealed to the State Board. Information was sent out in the February 8, 2018 Superintendent's Weekly Memo and information was collected by MSDE staff.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The number of requests by school system vary largely depending on the size of the school system itself. However, the majority of requests in all systems are handled at the local level; a very small percentage are appealed to the State Board. The most common reasons requests are made are usually childcare concerns or a parent is an employee of the system and is requesting the child be closer to the parent's workplace. The most common reasons for denials are generally around student performance and behavior and/or capacity issues at the desired school.

NOTE: Denials were typically inter-district with parents who live outside of Somerset County and may work within the county or outside of the county but have relatives who reside in Somerset. Their request is generally to have their child attend the school in the attendance zone of the relatives who would be providing beforeschool and after-school care for their child until they finish their work day.

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Note #1: Lines may not reconcile horizontally. For example, in Allegany County, there are 816 requests and 816 granted because the one that was denied at the Superintedent level was approved at the Board level. It was then counted in the total number granted.

Note #2: Baltimore County has two processes for a Special Permission Transfer Request. The first seven reasons are approved or denied at the school level by the principal. Applications that are approved are entered into the student information system but those that are denied are not tracked. The Special Permission Requests for Medical/Student Adjustment are submitted to the Director of the Office of School Climate. The decisions are made by the Director or his/her designee. Approvals and denials are entered into a database maintained by that office. The number in Total Number of Requests represents only the total number approved and those denied by the director/designee in the Office of School Climate. The total number granted represents all students enrolled as special permission transfers during the 16-17 school year, including those approved in prior years.
