

# Purpose of Office of Research and Strategic Data Use

- Create an organizational research agenda
- Execute the research agenda
  - Design and conduct internal research and data-use projects
  - Build and manage research alliances with institutional and academic partners
- Develop school system capacity to use data and conduct research

# Create an Organizational Research Agenda

- Determine the needs of the agency and develop a research agenda (a series of questions MSDE must answer to ensure the agency's policies and programs are effective).
  - Ex: Are schools and districts improving based on Maryland's accountability system?
  - Ex: Are professional development opportunities for teachers adequately addressing educators' needs?
  - Ex: What strategies have been successful in turning around low-performing high schools, and how can they be replicated at other schools?
- Create a plan for implementing the research agenda.  
Identify internal resources, external partners, and funding

# Execute the Research Agenda

- Design and conduct internal research and data-use projects.
- Build and manage research alliances with institutional and academic partners.
  - Process and approve external data requests
  - Seek out and manage partnerships
  - Coordinate partnerships across MSDE's offices and divisions
  - Ensure all studies are high quality and beneficial to Maryland's students

# Develop School System Capacity to Use Data and Conduct Research

- Provide training and/or technical support to Maryland's LEAs on describing and analyzing their own data, and selecting programs or interventions using strong standards of evidence.
- Provide technical support to districts as they evaluate the implementation of local programs.

# Processing External Data Requests

All studies that require access to state data (student, staff, or other non-public data) must go through a review process prior to approval.

- Researchers must submit a proposal during four windows during the year.
- Proposals are reviewed by the Office of Research to ensure scientific rigor, appropriate research design, and alignment to MSDE's research agenda.
- Proposals are reviewed by MSDE's External Research Review Committee (ERRC) to ensure relevance to MSDE and Maryland, and a minimal resource burden.
- Granted requests will go through a standardized MOU process, with all documents reviewed by MSDE to ensure appropriate data use and privacy.
