

Maryland State Department of Education: School Operating Status and Instructional Mode Data

In accordance with the requirements promulgated by the U.S. Department of Education for the allocation of federal funds under the American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ARP ESSER) Fund, the Maryland State Department of Education is required as part of its State Plan application to make data publicly available on its website (by June 21, 2021) on enrollment, attendance, and the mode of instruction for the most recent time period available.
