Discussion/Action Items

Overview of State and CAEP Evaluation of Approved Programs Re: Differentiation Outcomes

Ms. Michelle Dunkle and Ms. Liz Neal from the Program Approval Branch provided a presentation on the program approval process and the accountability system used to evaluate educator preparation programs. The goal for oversight of preparation programs is to enhance educator quality and provide assurance that Maryland's Prek-12 students are being taught by qualified, effective, competent teachers and principals.

Program Approval is required for all programs under COMAR 13A.07.06.01.
State Program Approval is required for all programs. Both State Program Approval and National Accreditation (NCATE/ CAEP) are required for all colleges/universities with over 2,000 full time students. Cyclical on-site reviews for these schools are jointly conducted

Approved Program pathways are Maryland Approved Programs (MAP) which includes college and university teacher preparation programs, and Maryland Approved Alternative Preparation Programs (MAAPP). All teacher education preparation programs submit an annual performance report. The reporting tool for college/university programs (MAAPPs) is the Teacher Preparation Improvement Plan (TPIP). MAAPPs load data into a web-based collection system, and complete an additional annual MAAPP evaluation report. In addition, thirteen IHEs submit an annual evidence-based report to NCATE. Finally, Federal Title II reporting ensures compliance with federal regulations.

State Standards are based on Maryland Institutional Performance Criteria which include:

- o Strong Academic Background
- o Extensive Internship
- o Performance Assessment
- o Linkage to Prek-12 Priorities

A Maryland priority is to close the achievement gap. Part of the Program Approval process is to enhance the accountability for its approved programs to adequately prepare candidates to work with diverse populations. The Program Approval staff reviewed Maryland Institutional Performance (Component IV, Linkage to PreK-12 Priorities, NCATE Standard 4: Diversity and the new CAEP expectations to go into effect in 2016.

Ms. Lin Blackman, the Director of the MAT Programs at Goucher College provided a presentation on "Differentiated Instruction in Teacher Education". She stated that differentiation is threaded throughout the Goucher College teacher preparation program and is included in standards, instruction, assignments, rubrics, and data collected. The emphasis on diverse student populations is a priority as it reflects the needs of public school partners, The Redesign of Teacher Education, Component IV and is an important part of instructional process.

Ms. Blackman also discussed how informal course and program assessment is ongoing as instructors and directors review data as it is generated. At Goucher the analysis of exit conferences with students is presented to the team each semester. Program strengths and needs are assessed and plans are made for program enhancements. The Goucher team also examines and evaluates candidates' work and uses the data collected regarding their standards to guide improvement and which helps to better prepare their graduates.

Dr. Maggie Madden, Program Approval Specialist presented the RTTT project "Preparing Educators for High Poverty/Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Schools". The board was able to understand the history behind the Maryland Teacher Consortium and its publication and also developed an understanding to how the Race to the Top Maryland Teaching Consortium project is positively impacting teacher preparation programs. Each PSTEB member received a copy the publication: Preparing Educators for High Poverty/Culturally Diverse Schools: A Manual for Teacher Educators, and Principals.
