February 6, 2020 Minutes

The 444th meeting of the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board (PSTEB) was held at the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE), 200 West Baltimore Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21201 on February 6, 2020. Mr. Christopher Lloyd called the meeting to order at 9:32 a.m.

Announcements

Dr. Patricia Saelens addressed the members in regards to the protocol and procedural process for the Board. Ms. Spross informed the Board members that all of the PSTEB minutes for 2018 and 2019 are now accessible and available on the website. Beginning with January 2020 agendas and minutes will be on the website in an accessible format. Individuals seeking minutes 2017 and prior will be available by contacting the Division of Educator Certification and Program Approval. The Division is now focused on the certification section of the website.

State Board Update

Dr. Miya Simpson presented the January 28, 2020 State Board summary to the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board (PSTEB).

Legislative Update

Ms. Spross presented the legislative update in the absence of Ms. Tiffany Clark. A brief summary was provided for each of the following items.

The Board focused discussions on the following Bills.

• HB476 - Education - Certification in Secondary Education Content Areas - Expanded Grade Range Requiring the State Board of Education to authorize a teacher certificated in secondary education to provide instruction in the teacher's content area to students in grades 6 through 12; and requiring the State Board to adopt certain regulations.

Mr. Lloyd asked the Board members if there was a motion in regards to taking a stand on HB476. There was no action requested for HB476.

• SB533 - Education - Teacher Certification - Montessori Schools

Making an individual eligible for a certificate to teach students in a Montessori school if the individual holds a Montessori-related credential from a certain organization and a bachelor's degree; authorizing the State Board of Education to require an individual to successfully pass an examination to be certified under the Act. Mr. Lloyd asked if the Board wished to take a position on SB533, because it will affect 69 schools.

A motion was put forth in regards to taking a vote on whether or not the members were in favor of supporting this bill or if they were opposed to supporting this bill.

Vote: Favor: 1 Opposed: 9 Abstain: 1

The motion failed, so the Board will take no position.

• HB794 - Education - Educational Interpreters - Certification Requirements

Requiring the State Board of Education and the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board to develop certain rules and regulations for the certification of educational interpreters; providing that certain individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing may not be denied the right to receive certain credentials or contract for work for which the individual is otherwise qualified because the individual is deaf or hard of hearing; requiring certain educational interpreters to obtain certification on or before July 1, 2027. This bill was introduced on February 3, 2020.

Discussion Points to be included in the letter of opposition:

- Unfunded
- Does not grandfather
- Reimbursement from State

- Potentially limit the pool
- Clarifying parent interpreter to interpreter for students.

Mr. Lloyd asked if there was a motion in support of HB794 or oppose HB794.

Motion Failed

Second Motion: Mr. Charles Hagan/Mr. Louis D'Ambrosio To adopt a move to oppose HB794.

Vote: Favor: 11 Opposed: 0 Abstain: 1

Motion Carried

Mr. Lloyd will write a letter stating PSTEBs opposition to HB794. Once the letter is complete, it will be shared with the Board members for their review and approval via a scheduled conference call.

Finally, Mr. Lloyd informed the Board members that HB2 would drop on February 7, 2020 and that he has heard that it is 300 pages. The hearing for this bill is scheduled for February 17, 2020. Once the bill drops, Mr. Lloyd will transmit it to PSTEB.

Ms. Spross provided a verbal update regarding the January 22, 2020, meeting of Dr. Salmon's Educator Preparation/Certification Advisory Committee. Committee discussion during the January 22, 2020, meeting focused on the proposed educator licensure regulations and the educator preparation regulations. Participants were provided the concern, proposed challenge to focus discussions, and items for consideration on each of the identified topics:

Educator Licensure Regulations:

• Basic Skills Assessment

- Master's Degree
- Renewal Requirements

Educator Preparation Regulations:

• Instruction/classroom management of a roster of students requirement

Ms. Spross was unable to complete her update presentation on the Educator Preparation/Certification Advisory Committee due to time restraints. Mr. Lloyd asked Ms. Spross to continue her presentation at the March meeting. The next meeting of the Educator Preparation/Certification Advisory Committee is scheduled for March 5, 2020.
