## Survey Respondents

## Geographic Representation

- Every local school system is currently represented



## Preliminary Survey Feedback

- Overall, the majority of respondents (63.6 percent) are in support of Maryland's Plan
- Respondents are evenly divided on how often should schools be measured on interim progress (one, two, or three years)
- Respondents generally feel School
  Improvement components (talent development, school culture/family engagement, leadership, and instructional transformation) are adequately addressed in the plan

# Preliminary Survey Feedback continued...

- Respondents generally believe that increasing professional learning, increasing recruitment efforts, providing regional support centers for resources, and providing regional support centers for greater access for preservice teachers are all effective ways to increase equitable access to effective teachers
- When asked how many years recently exited English learners (EL) should be included in the EL category, respondents are evenly divided between two, three, and four years
