### STATE BOARD SCHOOL YEAR 2020-2021 PRIORITIES

### ➤ Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP) Updates

(Presenter: Dr. Jennifer Judkins, Assistant State Superintendent, Division of Assessment, Accountability, and Information Technology)

Dr. Judkins provided updates and an overview of the MCAP, including changes from previous years, which assessments are administered, the timing for each general assessment, the Federal Peer Review and the Technical Advisory Committee, and future plans.

Board members inquired about differentiation between the MCAP ELA Math assessments, the assessment calendar and the remote administration plan, development of developmentally appropriate assessments, and assessing the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic (related to closures and virtual learning).

# > Waiver Request for Seniors Taking the American Government Assessment in the 2020-2021 School Year

(Presenter: Mary Gable, Assistant State Superintendent, Division of Student Support, Academic Enrichment & Educational Policy)

Dr. Salmon provided opening remarks and introduced Ms. Gable, who provided background information and clarification of graduation requirements for seniors, and presented the request for approval of a waiver of graduation requirements for 2020-2021 seniors who need to take the high school assessment in American Government in the 2020-2021 school year.

<u>ACTION</u>: Upon motion by Ms. McCusker and seconded by General Sumpter, the State Board approved the waiver request. (In Favor: 14; Opposed: 0; Abstained: 0.)

## ➤ Maryland High School Graduation Task Force Recommendations

(Presenter: Dr. Carol Williamson, Deputy State Superintendent for Teaching and Learning; Ms. Mary Gable, Assistant State Superintendent, Division of Student Support, Academic Enrichment & Educational Policy)

Dr. Williamson provided an overview and background on the Maryland High School Graduation Task Force (Task Force) and reviewed the recommended changes to the high school graduation regulation. The Task Force was first convened in January 2018 at the request of the State Board and State Superintendent and charged to review the regulation and make recommendations focused on three areas: credit and program requirements (number of credits, subject areas, and other requirements), assessments, and options for awarding high school diplomas. The Task Force is comprised of twenty-four organizations and stakeholder groups invited to appoint a representative.

State Board members inquired about assessment logistics and timing, clarification of the college ready endorsement, how other states are using assessments and opportunities for comparisons, and the expected impact on high school staffing.
