## MINUTES OF THE MARYLAND STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Maryland State Board of Education met in person on Tuesday, September 28, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. at the Maryland State Department of Education, 200 W. Baltimore Street, 7<sup>th</sup> Floor State Board Room, Baltimore, Maryland. The following members were present: Mr. Clarence Crawford (President); Mr. Charles R. Dashiell, Jr., Esq. (Vice President); Mr. Shawn Bartley; Ms. Gail Bates; Ms. Chuen-Chin Chang; Dr. Susan Getty; Ms. Jean Halle; Ms. Lori Morrow; Ms. Rachel McCusker; Dr. Joan Mele-McCarthy; Brigadier General (BG) Warner Sumpter; Dr. Holly Wilcox; Mr. Kevin Bokoum, Student Representative; and State Superintendent Mohammed Choudhury. Dr. Vermelle D. Greene was absent.

The following staff members also participated: Elliott L. Schoen, Assistant Attorney General; Dr. Sylvia Lawson, Deputy State Superintendent, School Effectiveness; Dr. Carol Williamson, Deputy State Superintendent, Teaching and Learning; Ary Amerikaner, Chief of Staff; and Dr. Miya T. Simpson, Executive Director, Office of the State Board.

President Crawford called the meeting to order and led the pledge of allegiance.

Mr. Schoen declared the presence of a quorum.

President Crawford welcomed members of the public and provided opening remarks.

**ACTION**: The State Board granted approval by unanimous consent.

## • Recognition of Staff

State Superintendent Choudhury recognized Dr. Carol Williamson, Deputy Superintendent, Office of Teaching and Learning, who will retire at the end of the month. State Superintendent Choudhury and State Board members thanked her for her commitment and service to the State and students of Maryland.

State Superintendent Choudhury introduced and welcomed Ms. Ary Amerikaner as his new Chief of Staff.

## STATE BOARD PRIORITIES

#### • Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board Overview

(Presenter: Ms. Kelly Meadows, Assistant State Superintendent, Office of Teaching and Learning)

Ms. Meadows provided an overview of PSTEB's statutory authority, regulatory requirements, composition, and purview, and explained amendments to House Bill 1300/Blueprint for Maryland's Future expanding the role of the PSTEB and giving the PSTEB and the State Board equal approval authority when promulgating regulations that fall within PSTEB's purview (i.e., educator preparation and certification). Ms. Meadows also introduced PSTEB Chair Maleeta Kitchen and Vice Chair Darren Hornbeck to provide brief remarks.

State Board members inquired about the make-up of the PSTEB, current vacancies, and representation for independent and non-publics that serve public school students. Ms. Kitchen and Mr. Hornbeck were also asked to share their thoughts on the teacher shortages and ways regulations could help address this issue.

ACTION: None. For information and discussion.

## • Local School System (LSS) Virtual Program Update

(Presenter: Dr. Carol Williamson, Deputy Superintendent, Office of Teaching and Learning; Val Emrich, Director of Instructional Technology, School Library, Media, and Mathematics; Erin Senior, Education Program Specialist II- Digital Learning)

Dr. Williamson and her team shared information related to 2021-2022 approved virtual learning programs in Maryland's local school systems, to include an update on enrollment of students, class sizes, number of virtual teachers and attendance policies, along with factors related to the monitoring timeline.

State Board members requested clarification regarding combination and blended programs and data on the pros and cons of each mode. Concerns were also raised about teachers being able to manage increased workloads in situations where enrollment numbers are high. Department staff were encouraged to review research on best practices. Ms. Halle asked that future reports include demand vs. enrollment by LSS.

ACTION: None. For information and discussion.

## Reopening Logistics and Transmission Rates in Schools

(Presenter: Dr. Carol Williamson, Deputy Superintendent, Office of Teaching and Learning; Mary Gable, Assistant State Superintendent, Division of Student Support, Academic Enrichment & Educational Policy)

Ms. Haislet provided an overview of how local school systems addressed reopening logistics including, vaccinations, ventilation, physical distancing, screening, testing, contact tracing, guidance, and messaging, Data on cases and numbers of students and staff who have needed to be quarantined since the opening of school was also shared.

State Board members discussed staff quarantining, the frequency of reporting across the state, and how many asymptomatic teachers are able to teach virtually, and expressed concern regarding the effect of teacher shortages and increased workloads.

## • Spotlight on Economically Disadvantaged Students

(Presenter: Chandra Haislet, Director, Accountability and Data)

Superintendent Choudhury provided opening remarks and introduced Ms. Haislet who provided an update on the Economically Disadvantaged student group. The presentation included statewide outcome data for FARMS students, the Community Eligibility Provision, and State initiatives to support economically disadvantaged students.

State Board members discussed including data on technical schools, disaggregating data by county, the influence of chronic absenteeism, and opportunities to partner with Medicaid on innovative programs that intersect with education.

ACTION: None. For information and discussion.

## • Blueprint Deep Dive: Neighborhood Indicators of Poverty

(Presenter: Chandra Haislet, Director, Accountability and Data)

Ms. Haislet provided information on the progress towards developing a neighborhood indicator of poverty in the Blueprint for Maryland's Future (Blueprint). The Blueprint requires the MSDE to conduct a study on neighborhood indicators of poverty with an interim report due November 1, 2021 to the Maryland General Assembly and the Accountability

Implementation Board (AIB), and a final report due October 1, 2022 to the AIB. The presentation highlighted efforts underway to collect more comprehensive and meaningful data and included a case study of the use and impact of neighborhood indicators of poverty in Texas.

State Board members expressed excitement about options and potential outcomes and also recommended adding a technical component and strong stakeholder outreach and engagement to the plan.

 COMAR 13A.14 Child and Family Day Care; COMAR 13A.15 Family Child Care; COMAR 13A.16 Child Care Centers; COMAR 13A.17 Child Care – Letters of Compliance; COMAR 13A.18 Large Family Child Care Homes (Permission to Publish)

Request for permission to publish proposed amendments and recommended modifications to the regulations. The proposed amendments align the regulations more closely with the requirements of the Federal Child Care Development Block Grant (CCDBG) Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 9858 et seq.) and are consistent throughout all five subtitles of regulations.

<u>ACTION</u>: Upon motion by Mr. Dashiell, and seconded by Ms. Bates, the State Board granted permission to publish the regulation. (In Favor: 12; Opposed: 1 – Mr. Bartley; Abstained: 0)

## STATE BOARD MEMBER COMMITTEE REPORTS/UPDATES

- Discussion of <u>2021-2022 priorities</u> established for the State Superintendent and an overview of strategic planning efforts underway. State Superintendent Choudhury provided brief comment on the distinction between the Blueprint and the Strategic Plan to be developed, noting that the Blueprint serves as a policy guide and the strategic plan lays out the plan for implementing and achieving established goals and priorities.
- President Crawford shared a positive health update.

- Mr. Bokoum provided information regarding the Maryland Association of Student Councils Fall Leadership Conference and shared that he will be the keynote speaker for Carroll County's student conference.
- Ms. Halle highlighted the recent article published in the National Association of State Boards of Education (NASBE) *Standard* discussing the work and report of the Task Force on Achieving Academic Equity and Excellence for Black Boys.

## **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Pursuant to § 3-305(b)(7) of the General Provisions Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, and upon motion of General Sumpter seconded by Ms. Halle and with unanimous approval, the Maryland State Board of Education met in closed session on Tuesday, September 28, 2021 in Conference Room #6, 8<sup>th</sup> Floor, at the Nancy S.     - 10. To discuss public security, if the public body determines that public discussion would constitute a risk to the public or to public security, including: (i) the deployment of fire and police services and staff; and (ii) the development and implementation of emergency plans.
    - 11. To prepare, administer, or grade a scholastic, licensing, or qualifying examination.
    - 12. To conduct or discuss an investigative proceeding on actual or possible criminal conduct.
  - ✓ 13. To comply with a specific constitutional, statutory, or judicially imposed requirement that prevents public disclosures about a particular proceeding or matter.
    - 14. Before a contract is awarded or bids are opened, to discuss a matter directly related to a negotiating strategy or the contents of a bid or proposal, if public discussion or disclosure would adversely impact the ability of the public body to participate in the competitive bidding or proposal process.
- 3. For each provision checked above, disclosure of the topic to be discussed and the public body's reason for discussing that topic in closed session.
