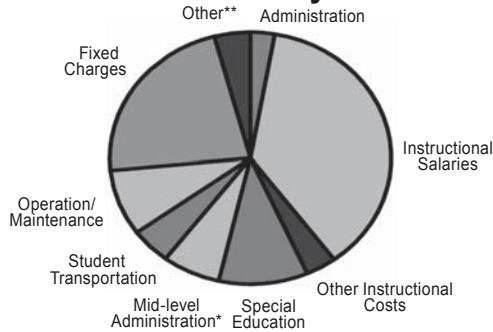

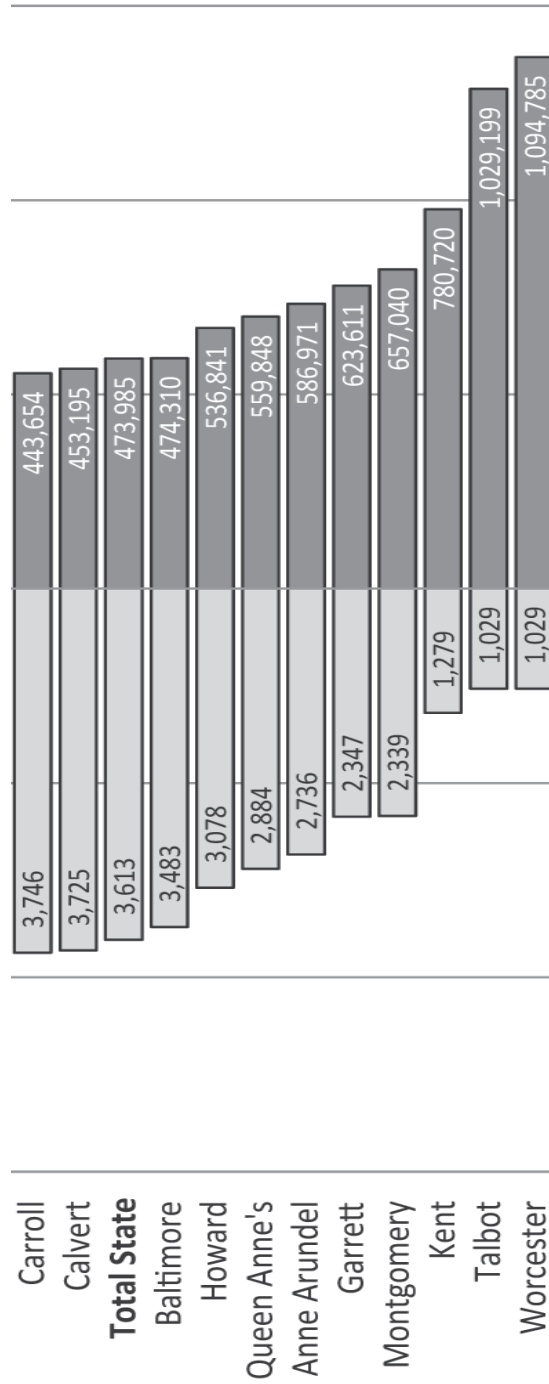
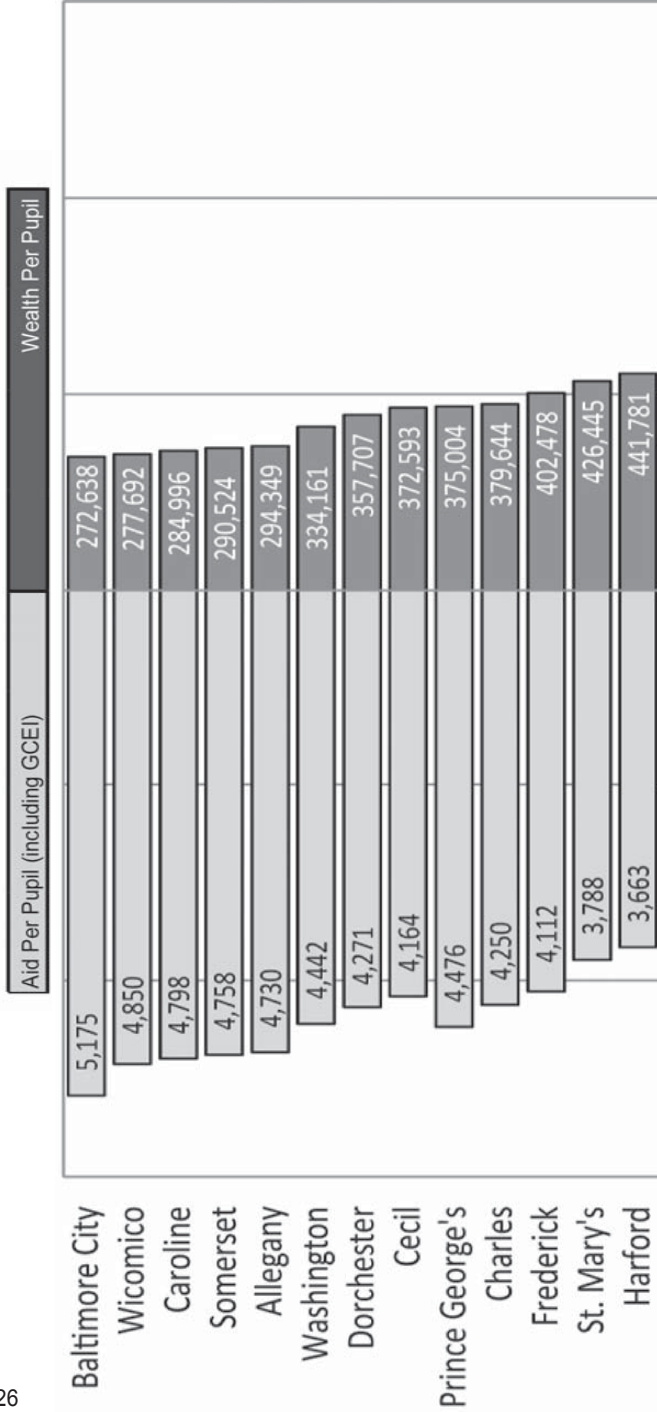
Cost per Pupil Belonging* Maryland Public Schools: FY 2014

Education Superlatives

- **Maryland's Public Schools have ranked in the top four in the nation for the past eight years by Education Week's Quality Counts report.** (Education Week)
- **Maryland, for the ninth year in a row, ranks 1st in the nation in the percentage of public school students scoring a 3 or better on at least one Advanced Placement (AP) exam.** (College Board)
- **Maryland ranks 9th in the nation in the number of new National Board Certified Teachers.** (National Board for Professional Teaching Standards)
- **Six Maryland Public Schools were selected as 2015 National Blue Ribbon Schools by the U.S. Department of Education.** (U.S. Department of Education)
- **In 2015, two Maryland Schools and one Maryland system were named National Green Ribbon Schools recipients. In the four years of the program's existence, 10 Maryland schools and two systems have been named winners.** (U.S. Department of Education)
- **Maryland's class of 2015 graduating seniors were offered more than \$1 billion in college scholarships.** (MSDE survey)
- **Maryland's environmental literacy standards received international acclaim in 2015. The State's educational plan for the environment received a Silver 2015 Future Policy Award from the World Future Council, the Inter-Parliamentary Union, and UNICEF.** (World Future Council)

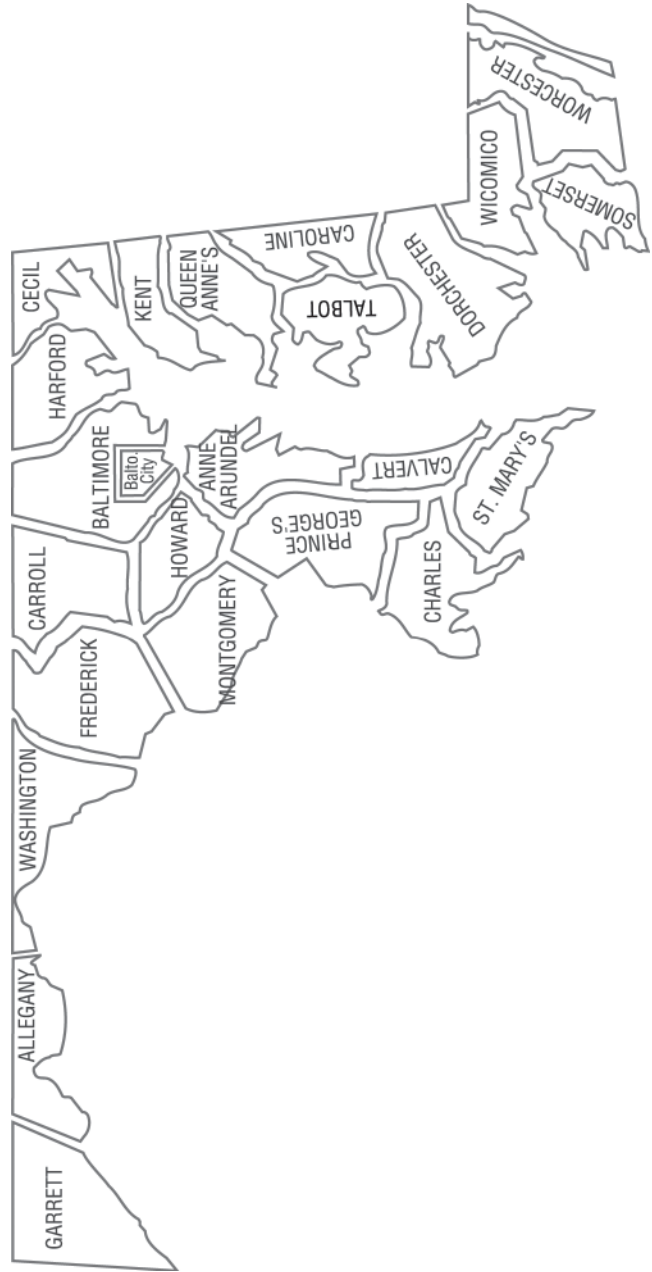
