

# Becoming a Teacher: Licensure Pathways

## Maryland Approved Program Pathway

- Bachelor's degree or higher
- Completion of a [Maryland approved program](#) leading to licensure
- Passing scores on [content licensure tests](#) (Praxis II)
- edTPA **OR** PPAT (Required July 1, 2025)

## Maryland Approved Alternative Program Pathway

- Bachelor's degree or higher
- Completion of a [Maryland resident teacher/alternative program](#) leading to licensure
- Passing scores on [content licensure tests](#) (Praxis II)
- edTPA **OR** PPAT (Required July 1, 2025)

## Out-of-State/Country License Pathway

- Bachelor's degree or higher **OR** US equivalency from an [approved transcript evaluation agency](#)
- Valid professional license/certificate in the area sought from another state or country
- edTPA **OR** PPAT (Required July 1, 2025)
- Pass the Praxis 5205 Teaching Reading Elementary assessment for elementary education, early childhood education, special education, and English to Speakers of Other Languages

## Experienced Nonpublic School Teacher Pathway

- Bachelor's degree or higher
- [Verification](#) of 5 years of effective teaching experience in the field and at the grade level of the license sought at a Maryland nonpublic school approved under COMAR 13A.09.09
- edTPA **OR** PPAT (Required July 1, 2025)
- Pass the Praxis 5205 Teaching Reading Elementary assessment for elementary education, early childhood education, special education, and English to Speakers of Other Languages

## In-District Training Program Pathway

- This pathway may only be assigned by a district to an educator if it is available.**
- Work directly with your district if the In-District Training Program Pathway is designated as an option for you.

## Out-of-State/Country Teacher Preparation Program Pathway

- Bachelor's degree or higher **OR** US equivalency from an [approved transcript evaluation agency](#)
- Completed teacher preparation program (to include an internship)
- edTPA **OR** PPAT (Required July 1, 2025)
- Pass the Praxis 5205 Teaching Reading Elementary assessment for elementary education, early childhood education, special education, and English to Speakers of Other Languages
