March 7, 2024

State Board Update

Mr. Hands also stated that the board also adopted the pre-k sliding scale as required in the Blueprint for Maryland's Future.

Mr. Hands stated that the board voted to oppose a number of curricular mandate bills along with a few other bills Ms. Meadows gave history and clarity as to the adoption of the regenerated praxis subject assessment for Special Education.
