Background Information

Information Related to § 7-910 Equivalent Access Requirements for Students with Disabilities.



§ 7-910 Equivalent Access Requirements for Students with Disabilities

Requires a local education agency (LEA) to provide equivalent access to digital tools for students with disabilities, including the development, purchase, and provision of certain digital tools.

- Ensures that certain **specifications** are used in grants and procurement contracts.
- Requires procurement contracts to **indemnify** the LEA for certain liabilities and costs.
- Requires a vendor who provides an LEA with a digital tool, that fails to meet specific measured standards, to modify the digital tool at the vendor's expense.



Implementation Timeline

• Notice of equivalent access is required for all bids, request for proposals, procurement contracts, grants or modifications whenever funds may be used to develop or obtain digital tools.
• Bids and requests for proposals must include an Accessibility Conformance Report (ACR) that includes a Voluntary Product Accessibility Template (VPAT).
• LEAs must report to MSDE on the accessibility of developed and purchased digital tools during the immediately preceding fiscal year.
• LEAs shall select from the available products that best meet the equivalent access standards and have the greatest functionality for equivalent access for students with disabilities. If no product is available, the LEA shall notify MSDE.

• LEAs shall select from the available products that best meet the equivalent access standards and have the greatest functionality for equivalent access for students with disabilities. If no product is available, the LEA shall notify MSDE.



(2) "Digital Tool" means:

- (i) Online Platform
- (ii) Online Course

(iii) Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Services, that are directly connected to student instruction

(iv) Digital Content

(v) Digital Technologies not requiring sight in an equally effective and integrated manner



(3) (i) "Equivalent access" means:

the ability to receive, use, and manipulate information and operate controls necessary to access and use information technology, including by nonvisual means, so that a student with disabilities can access the same services as a student without disabilities with substantially equivalent ease of use.

(ii) "Equivalent access" includes:

- 1. Keyboard controls used for input and synthesized speech;
- 2. Braille; and
- 3. Other audible or tactile means used for output.



(4) "Nonvisual access" means:

the ability to receive, use, and manipulate information and operate controls necessary to access information and communications technology through keyboard controls, synthesized speech, braille, or other methods not requiring sight.

LEA Process for Notification and Request to Obtain a Digital Tool that Does Not Meet Equivalent Access Standards



Selection of Products and Compliance

(e)(2)(i) If a local school system determines that a product that meets the equivalent access standards is not available, or if obtaining an available product would fundamentally alter the nature of the instructional activity or would result in an undue burden, the local school system shall notify the Department.

§7-910 Equivalent access requirements for students with disabilities



Education Article § 7-910 – Notification and Request to Obtain a Digital Tool that Does Not Meet Equivalent Access Standards

Section 7-910 of the Education Article sets forth certain requirements related to equivalent access for students with disabilities. Among other things, **beginning October 1, 2024**, local education agencies (LEAs) "shall select, from among the available products that offer pedagogical value, the available product that best meets the equivalent access standards and has the greatest functionality for equivalent access for students with disabilities, including blindness." Md. Code Ann., Ed. § 7-910(e)(1)(ii).

If an LEA determines a product that meets the equivalent access standards **is not available**, or if obtaining an available product would **fundamentally alter the nature of the instructional activity** or would **result in an undue burden**, the LEA is required to **notify MSDE of its determination**. MSDE, in turn, is required to consult with the **Department of Information Technology** and the **Department of Disabilities** to determine how to proceed. Md. Code Ann., Ed. § 7-910(e)(2)(i), (ii). In order to facilitate the consultation process, MSDE requires, at a minimum, the following information to be provided. MSDE may request additional information, as it determines, in its sole discretion, is needed to reach a decision under § 7-910(e)(2)(iii) or (iv).



MSDE, DoIT and MDOD Consultation

MSDE, Department of Information Technology (DoIT) and the Department of Disabilities (MDOD) determine next steps on requests.



Selection of Products and Compliance

(e) (ii) After the Department receives a notice under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, the Department shall consult with the Department of Information Technology and the Department of Disabilities to determine how to proceed.

(iii) If, after the consultation process, the Department determines that there is an available product that meets the equivalent access standard, a local school system shall obtain that product.

(iv) If, after the consultation process, the Department determines that there is no available product that meets the equivalent access standards, a local school system may, with the Department's approval, obtain a product that does not meet the equivalent access standards but provides the best equivalent functionality.

§7-910 Equivalent access requirements for students with disabilities



Once MSDE received the completed Notification and Request to Obtain a Digital Tool that Does Not Meet Equivalent Access Standards

Depending on the volume of request the process may take up to 2 months to complete.
