### LOCAL FLEXIBILITY FOR LIR



- Allocations are formula-based through a combination of base funding by LEA size (small, medium, large) and October 1 student count
- Flexibility allows the LEA to reallocate funds to address locally identified priorities across *Imperatives* without minimizing the LEA's commitment to change [Justification Statement]
- Changes in the Local Allocation for *Imperatives* must be approved by the Assistant State Superintendent using the LIR Distribution Request Form
- The LEA request must be received on or before May 5
- Materials and Supplies are capped at 10%

EQUITY AND EXCELLENCE

34 CFR § 300.226, 34 CFR § 300.646

- Reserves mandatory 15% of Part B 611 & 619
- Identifies and addresses <u>factors</u> <u>contributing to system level significant</u> <u>disproportionality</u>
- Provides support to <u>children with or</u> <u>without IEPs</u>, age 3 through grade 12 (cannot be used fully on SWD or IEP Services)
- Uses funding to <u>supplement not supplant</u>
   State, local, and other federal funds
- Tracks and monitors <u>expenditures aligned</u> to use of funds
