


Overview of Maryland High School School Diploma Numbers



Diplomas and Certificates

To be awarded a **Maryland High School Diploma**, a student must (1) complete the enrollment, credit, and service requirements, (2) complete local school system requirements, and (3) meet the graduation assessment requirements. (COMAR 13A.03.02.09B)



A Maryland High School Certificate of Program Completion is awarded to students with disabilities who cannot meet the requirements for a diploma but who meet alternative standards under COMAR 13A.03.02.09E.

Cohort Trends, Graduation Rate and The Numbers



Maryland Graduation and Dropout Rates Overview

A **graduation cohort** is a group of students who begin as first-time ninth graders in a particular school year (adjusted by student transfers or death).

Class of 2021 cohort were first-time 9th graders in 2017 – 2018.

Dropout cohorts are students who terminate formal education during high school.


Maryland measures a four-year and a five-year cohort graduation rate and a four-year dropout rate.





Four-Year Cohort Graduation Rate Trend


Maryland's four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate has increased from prior year from 86.8% to 87.2%.


Four-Year Cohort Graduation Rate by Student Groups

Difference of Student Groups to All Students. The Four-Year Graduation Rate for All Students in 2021 was 87.2%.



Four- Year Cohort Graduation Rate by Local Education Agency


Maryland's four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate is 87.2%.





Five-Year Cohort Graduation Rate Trend


Maryland's five-year adjusted cohort graduation rate has decreased from prior year from 88.9% to 88.3%.






Four-Year Cohort Dropout Rate Trend

Maryland's four-year adjusted cohort dropout rate has decreased from prior year from 8.3% to 7.4%.






Four-Year Cohort Dropout Rate by Student Groups







College Readiness Assessments AP Participation






AP Exams taken by Graduating Class




College Readiness Assessments AP Participation

Maryland's 2021 AP Participation by Graduating Class is 43.6%.






SAT Participation by Graduating Class

Maryland students saw an increase across Race/Ethnicity Student Groups for Total Score in 2021 as compared to 2020.




SAT Performance by Graduating Class



College Readiness Assessments: SAT by Local Education Agency

Nearly all Local Education Agencies provide an opportunity for students to participate as part of the SAT school day. In school year 2020-2021, 21 LEAs offered SAT school day.








Postsecondary Enrollment All Students

Fewer Maryland students are enrolling in postsecondary institutions. Of the 2020 graduates, 60.5% enrolled within 12 months which is a 5.8% drop from 2019.



Postsecondary Enrollment 12 Months by Local Education Agency



AP Participation by Graduating Class


