




In 2019, Lakeland outperformed Maryland's proficiency trend in ELA and math in grades 3-5.

## Lakeland Enrollment Over Time (1 of 2)


Lakeland's enrollment nearly doubled from 2011 to 2020. In comparison, Baltimore City's enrollment declined by more than 7,000 students over this period.


## Lakeland Enrollment Over Time (2 of 2)

## Lakeland Enrollment by Grade


Lakeland enrolled between 78 and 116 students in grade Pre-K through 8.




2022-2023 Enrollment, by Grade

## Lakeland Enrollment by Student Demographics

Enrollment by Student Group, 2021-2022






# **Students within each Neighborhood Tier**

86% of students in Baltimore City live in Tier 4 or 5 neighborhoods.

Statewide, ~20% of students reside in each Tier.

In Baltimore City,

- 66% students are in Tier 5
- 20% students are in Tier 4
- 7% students are in Tier 3
- 5% students are in Tier 2
- 2% students are in Tier 1



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Lakeland is located in a Tier 5 neighborhood which borders Tier 2, 3, and 5 neighborhoods.




Maryland Neighborhood Tiers: Baltimore City


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## Lakeland Enrollment by Neighborhood Tier

Enrollment by Economically Disadvantaged Status and SES Tier of Residence






## Achievement over Time

Note: No state assessments were administered in 2019-2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.




#### Grade 3-8 Math Proficiency



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## **KRA, ELA and Math Achievement**


Lakeland performed significantly below the state average in the most recent Kindergarten Readiness and MCAP ELA and Math assessments.





#### Accountability Percentile Rank


The percentile rank shows how the school's performance compares to other Maryland schools. For example, an elementary school with a percentile rank of 65 means that the school performed as well or better than 65% of all other Maryland elementary schools, and 35% of elementary schools performed better than this school.

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Lakeland performed below schools with similar percentages of Economically Disadvantaged students in Math but performed at the median in ELA.


Schools with 40-44% Economically Disadvantaged Students






