SUBJECT:	Maryland School Report Card Results, SY 2022-2023

Purpose

The purpose of this item is to provide an overview of the Maryland School Report Card and highlight the results from SY 2022-2023 including the star rating of schools and accountability system school designations.

Background/Historical Perspective

With the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Maryland submitted a consolidated state plan detailing how the law will be implemented, including how it will hold schools accountable for student performance. The State plan was approved by the U.S. Department of Education in early 2018, and the first Maryland School Report Cards were released later that year. The State released two years of results (SY 2017-2018 and SY 2018-2019) prior to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Recognizing the extraordinary circumstances from the COVID-19 pandemic the U.S. Department of Education granted Maryland waivers from the accountability requirements of the ESEA for the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years and the assessment requirements for the 2019-2020 school year. The publication of Maryland School Report Cards was paused until the SY 2021-2022 year three results. Due to the pandemic, the SY 2021-2022 results included one-year adjustments for chronic absenteeism and growth. The Maryland School Report Card SY 2022-2023 year four results return to the pre-pandemic methodology.


Maryland School Report Card Overview

1. Maryland School Report Card Overview

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Maryland Accountability System Overview

- The Maryland Accountability System is based on 100 total possible points on indicators which vary by grade span.
- The SY 2022-2023 results return to the methodology outlined in Maryland's ESSA state plan.
- New this year is the inclusion of social studies grade 8 assessment measure in the Academic Progress indicator for middle schools.
- Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI), and Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) schools are identified on a three-year cycle and are not identified this year. Schools identified from the school year 2021-2022 data continue to receive supports and interventions.



Maryland Accountability System reporting on Maryland School Report Cards.

Total earned percent

- Each school's total earned points, divided by its total possible points
- Ex: If a school earned 55 points out of a possible 85 points, its total earned percent is 55/85 or 65%.

Awarded stars

- Each school will be awarded stars based on its total earned percent.
- Ex: If a school earned 65% of the total possible points, four stars will be awarded.

Percentile rank

- Each school will receive a percentile rank, comparing its performance to all other Maryland schools of the same grade span (elementary, middle, or high).
- Ex: About 77 percent of Maryland elementary schools earned <u>less than</u> 65% percent of their total possible points. An elementary school with a total earned percent of 65% is therefore in the 77th percentile—it performed better than 77 percent of Maryland elementary schools.


Maryland School Report Card Results

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Star Rating by School Type, SY 2022-2023

Across all school types, 37% of schools earned a star rating of 4 or 5.

Over 75% of schools earned a star rating of 3, 4, or 5.





School Report Card results are provided by student groups.


Both Black/African American and Hispanic student group data show lower results as compared to the White student group and All students.

School Report Card results show that English learner, economically disadvantaged, and students with disability student groups perform lower than All students.





Star Ratings, SY 2022-2023 and SY 2021-2022

Across all school types, more schools earned 3stars in the accountability system in SY 2022-2023 as compared to SY 2021-2022.

This trend is accompanied by a decrease in the number of schools receiving 5-stars.

How many schools had a star rating change in SY 2022-2023?

Most schools had the same star rating in SY 2022-2023 as compared to SY 2021-2022. Of the schools that changed star ratings, more than three times as many had a lower star rating as had a higher rating.

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New Measure: MCAP Social Studies Grade 8 Assessment

- MCAP Social Studies assessment is administered at the end of Grade 8 and consists of four, 40-minute sections. The first operational administration took place in SY 2022-2023.
 - Measures the percent of grade 8 students scoring at or above proficiency on six Maryland Social Studies Standards: Civics, Peoples and Nations of the World, Geography, Economics, History, and Skills and Processes.
 - A standard setting panel of Maryland educators convened on July 17–18, 2023 to determine the cut scores for each of the four performance levels: Beginning Learners, Developing Learners, Proficient Learners, and Distinguished Learners.
- The More Learning Less Testing Act of 2017 (Md. Ed. Art §7-203) required the development and implementation of a middle school grade band social studies assessment.
- With the SY 2022-2023 School Report Cards, this state requirement is now incorporated within the Academic Progress Indicator for Middle Schools. The measure is worth 3.5 points.

Based on state-level accountability results, **37% of eighth grade students scored at or above proficiency** on the MCAP Social Studies 8 assessment.
