SUBJECT: Cohort Graduation and Dropout Rates

Purpose

To provide the State Board with the 2024 4-year Adjusted Cohort Graduation and Dropout Rates and the 2023 5-year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate. College enrollment data will also be presented.

Background

The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) collects data from local education agencies (LEAs) to meet federal and state requirements. The 4-year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate is a federally required measure for reporting the percentage of students that successfully complete high school in four years with a regular high school diploma. This uniform measure is comparable across states, LEAs, and individual schools, and allows for consistent reporting over time. Additionally, Maryland calculates a 5-year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate and a 4-year Adjusted Cohort Dropout Rate.

Maryland Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates Overview

An **adjusted graduation cohort** is a group of students who begin as first-time ninth graders in a particular school year.

- It is called "adjusted cohort" because students who transferred in during the four years of high school are added to the cohort, while students who transferred out and others are removed.
- Maryland measures a four-year and a five-year adjusted cohort graduation rate, and a four-year dropout rate.


Example

- There were 67,349 students in the class of 2024 4-year adjusted cohort; these students were first-time ninth graders in SY 2020-2021.
- Out of those, 58,965 obtained a high school diploma within four years, resulting in a four-year graduation rate of 87.6%.



Maryland Four-Year Cohort Graduation Rate Trend

The four-year cohort graduation rate was 1.8 percentage points higher in the 2023-2024 school year as compared to the prior year.





Maryland Four-Year Cohort Graduation Rate by Student Groups

Four-year cohort graduation rates were higher in the 2023-2024 school year compared to the 2022-2023 school year for several student groups, with the largest increases seen for Hispanic students and multilingual students.



Maryland Four-Year Cohort Graduation Rate by LEA

The 2023-2024 school year four-year adjusted cohort graduation rates vary by LEA, from less 71% to 95% or higher.







The 2023-2024 school year four-year cohort dropout rate was lower than the 2022-2023 school year dropout rate.






Postsecondary Enrollment (12 Months) Trend

More than 62% of students in the 2023 graduating class enrolled in postsecondary education within 12 months, slightly higher than the prior year.
